

The Telegraph states the arrival of the Tom Toby at Galveston, with a "very valuable prize of a large fine brig, strongly built and capable of being flitted out as a man of war, bearing guns heavier than any now in the Mexican squadron. She was captured on the coast of Campeachy, having 200 tons of salt on board. The Tom Toby was left in hot pursuit of two Mexican schooners."
