

YUCATAN. The schooner Magnet arrived at New Orleans, brings accounts from Merida of the 15th, and from Campeachy to the 14th ult. The Mexicans had finally, evacuated the heights of Campeachy, and had proceeded to Laguna, whence they were to embark on board the fleet and transport vessels (forming altogether sixteen sail) to be conveyed to Tampico and Vera Cruz. The Yucatan commissioners for settling a definitive treaty of peace with Mexico had not yet sailed for Vera Cruz, but were only awaiting the final departure of the Mexican forces from Lerma.

The Texan squadron still remained at Campeachy. The Mexican steamers were at Laguna.
